The Readings for the Weekend of July 14 & 15

First Reading – Amos 7:12-15 (104B)
Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 85:9-10, 11-12, 13-14
Second Reading – Ephesians 1:3-14
Gospel – Mark 6:7-13

*I have called you by your name-you are mine.
(Isaiah 43:1)*

Do Catholics re-crucify Christ at every Mass? – No, we do not. Jesus died only once. During the Mass, we remember the sacrifice that Jesus made for us on Calvary, and we unite ourselves to the sacrifice that Christ made by offering to God all that we are and all that we do?

Why is it called the Mass? – The word “Mass” comes from the Latin word missa, which means “to send.” The Mass prepares us spiritually to live as authentic followers of Jesus Christ in our everyday lives.

Why do some people call the Mass “liturgy”? – A liturgy is any public ritual that the Church celebrates. In the past, the Mass was called “Divine Liturgy.”

Why can’t someone just “pray at home”? – It is good to pray at home, yet private prayer doesn’t take the place of attending Mass. When you pray at home, your prayer is personal and one-dimensional. When you are at Mass, you pray in union with other believers as part of a community. The Mass gives you the opportunity to seek forgiveness for your sins, be inspired by the readings and the homily, offer yourself to the Lord, reach out to others with the peace of Christ, forgive others during the Lord’s Prayer, receive the Body and Blood of Christ, and become empowered to carry the presence of Christ into the world.

Why do we have to attend Mass every weekend? – The moral obligation to attend Mass has been Church law since the fourth century. But rather than think of it as something we “have to do,” we should think of Mass as valuable time spent with our loving God and others. When we go to Mass, we begin to see that we are not alone and recognize that we are part of the Body of Christ, and if one part of the body is missing, the whole body suffers.



Life is Beautiful: “Prayer for the Protection of Human Life” Heavenly Father, Lord and Maker of all that is good, fill our hearts with joy before the wonders of your creation. Open our eyes to the presence of your beloved Son Jesus in all those we encounter and especially in the weakest and most vulnerable among us. Where we see life threatened, at its beginning, or at its end, or by poverty and deprivation, inspire us with love and mercy, so that, empowered by your Holy Spirit, we may work together to defend human dignity. Help us to build a culture of life: a culture in which each and every person is loved and valued as your child, from conception to natural death, and in every circumstance of life. Amen.


