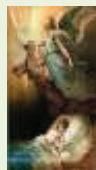

And when the priest Communion takes,

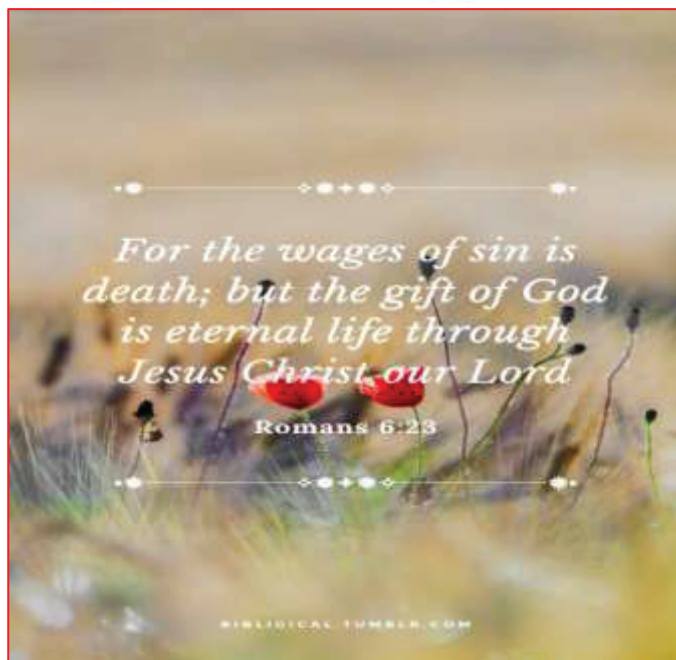
Oh, bring my Lord to me, That His sweet Heart may rest on
