PENTECOST SUNDAY

After Easter Sunday, Christmas is the second-greatest feast in the Christian liturgical calendar, but Pentecost Sunday is not far behind. Coming 50 days after Easter and ten days after the Ascension of Our Lord, Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. For that reason, it is often called the "the birthday of the Church."

The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations.

Pentecost is also a Jewish holiday, which the Jews use to celebrate the end of Passover. Jews celebrate the gift of the law to Moses at Mt. Sinai on this day. But we, as Catholics celebrate the birth of our Church.

At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles and the Eleven. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand one another.

Prayer to be Filled with All the Fullness of God

Living God, thank You for the surpassing greatness of Your power to us who believe. Because You came to dwell in us on Pentecost, we have Your mighty strength with which You raised Christ from the dead. Strengthen us in our inner being, so that we can know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge and be filled with all the fullness of God. Amen.

Holy Hour for Life –Every Monday. The Legion of Mary will lead a Holy Hour for Life from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm in the Chapel. We will pray three mysteries of the Rosary for an overturn of abortion and for protection of life from conception to natural death.

The **Legion of Mary** is a worldwide organization where Catholic men and women and children (8 and up) sanctify themselves through weekly prayers and spiritual works in union with Blessed Mary. The purpose of the **Legion of Mary** is to mobilize the Catholic laity and raise the spiritual level of the parish and community by visits to the sick, teaching CCD and evangelization. Members pray the legion prays and the rosary daily and re-consecrate themselves to the Blessed Mother Mary yearly.

WHAT DRAWS PEOPLE INTO THE CATHOLIC FAITH?


While there are many different circumstances that lead a person in the direction of Catholicism, the simple answer is, "Because God has called them."




