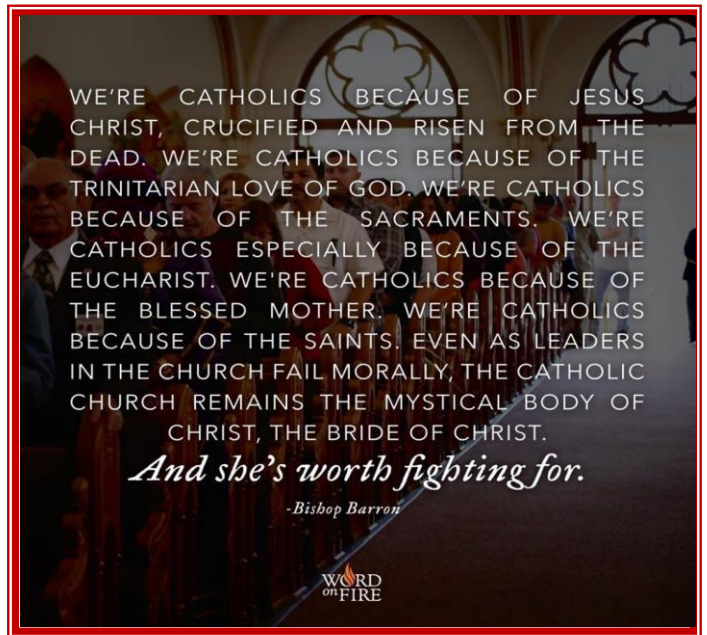

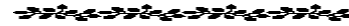

Thank you to all who assisted in the preparation and all who attended the Blue Mass honoring our First Responders.



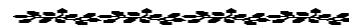
